ASAA HISTORY TIME LINE

July 30 1959

James Patrick Moran and Emilie Moran sell lot 7 of block31 southwest Quarter section22 township 16 plan464A New Westminster district, to Old Age Pensioners organization branch 69, a branch of Old Age Pensioners organization located at Abbotsford, British Columbia.

April 14 1972 OAPOA purchase lot 7A from Gordon Gilman and Katie Gilman.

January 25 1973 OAPOA incorporates as Abbotsford Old Age Pensioners Organization.

July 29 1976 AOPOA purchase lot 6 from John Cameron.

March 05 1980 Special resolution passed to purchase lots 20,21,22,23.

April 01 1980 AOPOA purchase lot 20,21,22 and 23 from Earl Hoyle Croisdale. Transfer of estate January 02 1981.

February 18 1981 Lots 20,21,22,23 amalgamated into single lot.

March 15 1983 AOPOA purchase lot 5 from Richard J. Peters.

October 12 1995 AOPOA change name to Abbotsford Seniors' Association.

November 01 2012 ASA changes name to Abbotsford Social Activities Association.

June 23 2016 Certificate of good standing Society Act issued to ASAA.
